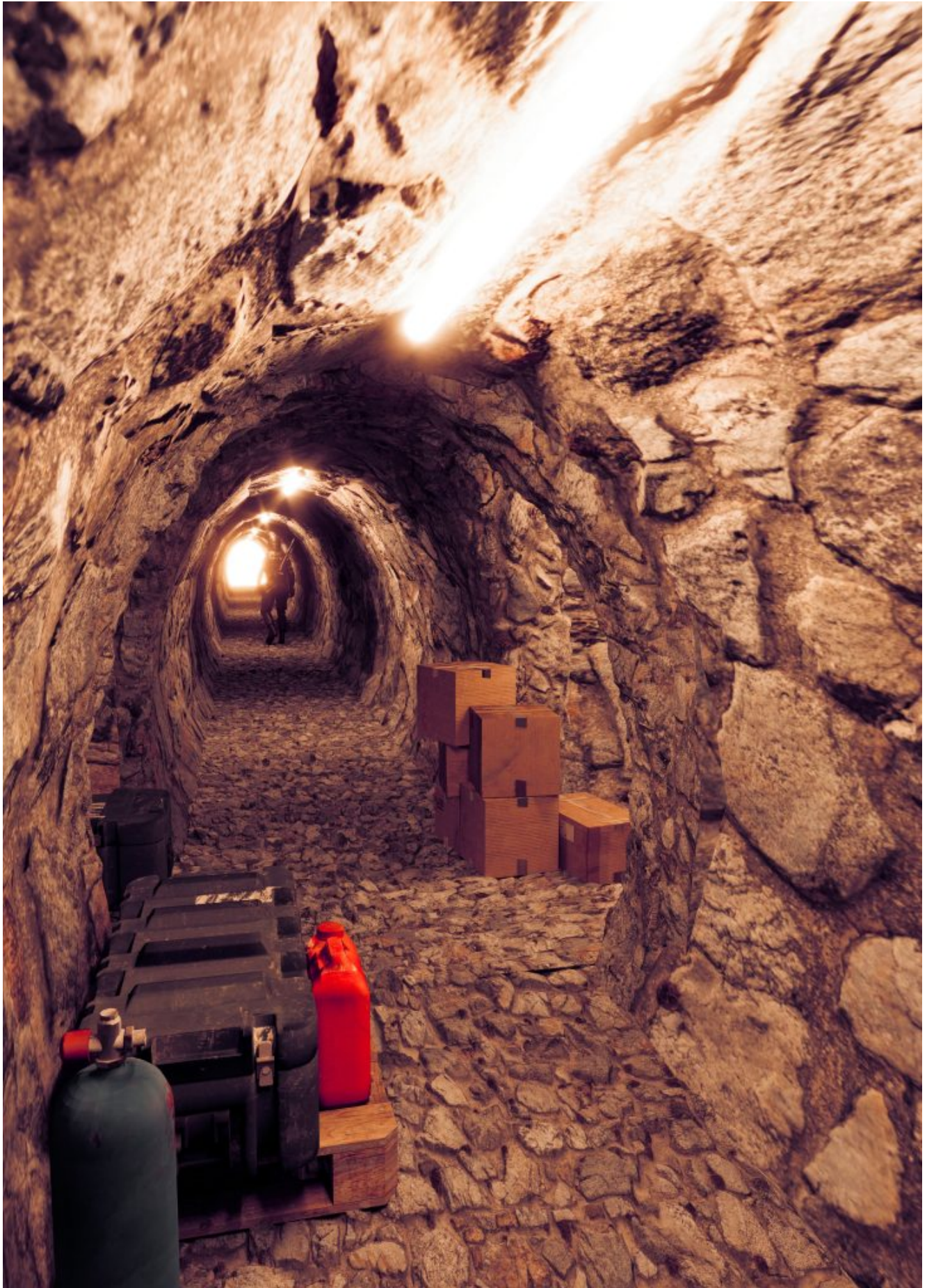
Prof. Kobi Michael in JNS: The Rafah Crossing has served as the main platform
